Traditionally scallop thatching was the predominant thatching method in Ireland. The name comes from the horizontal and bent rods of hazel, willow, ash, briar, bog fir etc. used to secure thatch to the roof structure. The bent rods are shaped like hairpins or staples and the ends pointed.

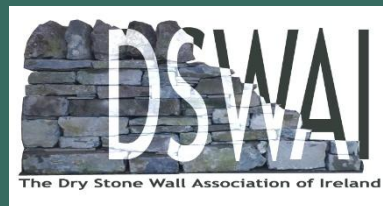

Come join us for a hands-on four-day workshop on rope thatching with Inishowen-based rope thatcher Brian Lafferty. This course will have a particular focus on rope thatch using flax.

Traditionally rope thatching was the predominant thatching method along the exposed west Atlantic coast in response to the high winds. On rope-thatched houses, the thatch was held in place by ropes, tied to stones or metal pegs projecting at the top of the walls underneath the eaves. In recent decades, this traditional method of rope thatching has been replaced by scollop thatching and non-traditional styles.

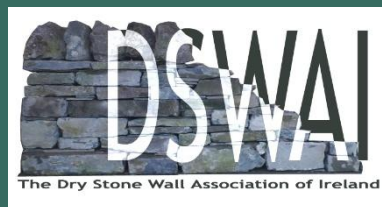

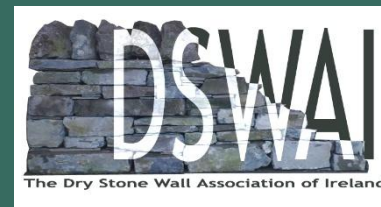
