This year sees the welcome return of the joint Ulster Architectural Heritage and Irish Georgian Society Summer School: *Conservation Without Frontiers*.

The theme of the Summer School is 'Living Towns & Villages in Cavan & Fermanagh' and once again, the school will bring together students, experts, professionals and enthusiasts to explore, discuss and debate issues facing our shared Irish heritage. The programme will offer many unique opportunities to visit and engage with the history and heritage of the local area, with a particular emphasis on the development and regeneration of towns. Speakers throughout the Summer School include architects, architectural historians, planners, and practitioners involved with Ireland's architectural heritage.

The three day programme will explore the conservation issues faced in the regeneration of Irish rural towns and villages, and share projects which benefit local communities and support the unique built heritage of these places. The programme includes lectures and discussions with site visits to towns and the opportunity to study buildings of architectural interest. Participants will explore how buildings and townscapes can benefit from good conservation practice whilst also making a positive contribution to the local community and individuals who use them.

The summer school is directed by Kevin Mulligan, (Director of the 2015/2017 UAH/IGS Summer Schools) and author of *Buildings of South Ulster*. The Chairman of the Summer School is Primrose Wilson CBE. The Summer School is recognised as CPD by Royal Institute of the Architects of Ireland.

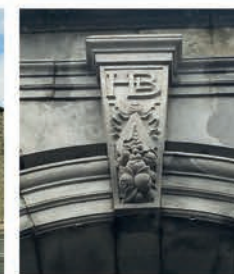
